Violins against Concealment

'Lebenslaute' (Life Sounds) plays in front of the Federal Office for the Protection of the Constitution and supports the Tribunal 'Resolving the NSU-complex'.

Cologne, May 19th 2017 – Staff of the Federal Office for the Protection of the Constitution were greeted by protests this morning. The open music and action group Lebenslaute greeted staff with classical music in support of the Tribunal 'Resolving the NSU-complex' which is taking place in the Schauspiel Cologne.

“Ten people have been killed, dozens harmed by the NSU. The Office for the Protection of the Constitution has cultivated the murder for far too long by administering a network of informants, instead of taking consequent action against neo-Nazis. Files were destroyed or not issued, evidence went missing. It's time we get to know the truth,” says Tim Klodzko from the federal alliance 'Resolving the NSU-complex' which has organised the Tribunal. “We demand all hushed files to be delivered to the Tribunal by Saturday so that the circumstances of the crimes can finally be clarified!”

Since 1986 musicians from across the country are performing as a full choir and orchestra under the name LEBENSLAUTE once annually, and as smaller ensembles throughout the year. As an open music and action group Lebenslaute takes classical music to venues where it is not expected: to military drill grounds, nuclear power plants, missile depots, immigration authorities and other life- and people threatening places.

The Tribunal 'Resolving the NSU-complex' is taking place from May 17th-21st in the Depot of the Schauspiel Cologne. Together with many people and initiatives standing in solidarity, those affected and hurt will raise their voices, portray their experiences and indict.
